Cancellation/Refund Policy Student Rights and Responsibilities

Cancellation/Refund Policy

Cancellation Policy

In the event that a student must cancel their program, the school must receive a written notification of the cancellation by completing a cancellation/refund form available from the school. Refunds are processed according to the terms below:

% of Program Completed	% Tuition Refunded			
Cancellation 30 days or more before the <u>start date</u>	75% (minus registration fee)			
Cancellation less than 30 days before the <u>start date</u>	50% (minus registration fee)			
0 - 24% of the <u>length of study</u>	25% of tuition remaining (minus registration fee)			
Over 25% of the <u>length of study</u>	0%			

- ** The <u>start date</u> refers to the first day at OCC, not individual program start dates.
- *** Length of study refers to the entire duration of your registration, not the length of individual programs

Tuition Refund

Students who are unable to obtain the necessary permits to enter Canada will receive a 100% refund to tuition fees, less the \$195.00 Registration fee. The school must receive written notification of the cancellation by completing a cancellation/refund request form available from the school and send a copy of the letter of rejection from Citizenship and Immigaration Canada before the refund will be processed.

Accommodation Refund

Cancellation Prior to Arrival

- a) If the student cancels within 2 weeks prior to arrival, the homestay registration fee and two weeks homestay will be charged.
- b) In the event that the students does not arrive to homestay, the 4-week homestay fee will be applied.

Cancellation After Arriva

Students are expected to provide 30 days notice of withdrawal from the homestay program. Students who withdraw after arrival will not receive a refund of the Homestay Registration Fee, or the remainder of the homestay session (4 weeks). Students are welcome to stay with the host throughout the notice period.

Cancellation Due to Visa Denial

If a student cancels due to a visa denial, the accommodation placement fee will be refunded, along with homestay fees paid after the visa refusal letter is submitted to Oxford College of Canada's administration staff.

Conditions of Enrolment

Oxford College of Canada (OCC) reserves the right to refuse any undesireable registration. OCC reserves the right to change start dates, programs, and course content at any time and without prior notice. Fees, dates and conditions listed in the school brochure are subject to change without prior notice. Courses are available based on enrolment.

OCC and its directors and shareholders accept no responsibility whatsoever for any lost or damage to the personal belongings or property of student or program participants or for any injury to or death of a student or program participant occurring on or off school property.

Violation of Student Code of Conduct

- 1) The violation will be brought to the attention of the Director by completion of Student Referral Form by an OCC staff member.
- 2) The student will initially be informed of the violation by an OCC Counselor. They will arrange a time and date to meet to discuss the matter. The student will be provided at least one day's notice of the meeting. If no Counselor that speaks the student's language is available, the student will be provided with the option of arranging for an interlocutor to attend.
- 3) The student and any student-appointed interlocutor will meet with the Counselor and/or Director to discuss the violation.
- 4) The attendees from the previous meeting will reconvene at the pre-arranged time and date to outline the findings and any resulting sanctions. Sanctions may include but not limited to: i) continued monitoring of behaviour to ensure adhereence to the Student Code of Conduct. ii) forfeiture of the school certificate. iii) suspension from school. iv) expulsion from the school with no refund
- 5) On completion of the process, documentation including Student Referral Form, meeting minutes on the findings and sanctions will be kept in the Student File.
